

## BIO GUEST SPEAKER JENNIFER PRINCE

Jen grew up in the small lakeside town of Wheatley and moved to London in 2004. She and her husband, Rick, have four children in their teens and early 20s, and have been married for 25 years this spring.

Jen worked on nursing and activation staff in community support, retirement and long term care homes in her early twenties, and was a musician in a couple of bar bands before her kids were born. She stayed home caring for her family after the arrival of the second child, and then found herself working at Siloam United Church in London in 2014 and entering into discernment for ministry not long after that.

After 2 years of discernment and 6 years of study at the Centre for Christian studies in Winnipeg and St. Andrew's College in Saskatoon, Jen earned her Diaconal Ministry Diploma and was Commissioned into ministry in the United Church in the spring of 2023. She is currently serving with Richards Memorial and Metropolitan United Churches in London, and having the time of her life doing so.
