- **Connect-Clinic** 
  - This program offers telemedicine-based medical consultations, advice and treatment related to trans care, including general health and wellness services, hormone therapy, and surgery referrals. The current wait period is around 8-12 months.
  - In the meantime, if your family physician would like some advice around trans related care such as HRT, they can contact Dr. Greenaway via OTN eConsult and she will be happy to offer support.
