Greetings to you on behalf of the Prairie to Pine Regional Council Executive.

As we contemplate holding a second regional meeting, we know it will be very different from last year.

- Some will grieve the fact that we won't be meeting face to face, as such gatherings are a chance to meet people of faith we might not otherwise get to know.

- We have tried to listen to the Calls to the Church to find respectful ways of being together as indigenous and settler churches.
- The Calls to Change have asked us to become more attentive to intercultural ways of being and let go of white culture exclusivity.
- The priorities the Listening Team brought before us from the last Regional Meeting have been in our hearts.

As a governance body, we've had decisions to make and time is precious. Sometimes we reverted to familiar ways of doing things that did not take these things into account. Yet we have sought
