# Study Overview

## Project Title:

### Patient & Provider Experiences with Musculoskeletal (MSK) Care in Alberta

Musculoskeletal (MSK) conditions, particularly those affecting the low back, knee and shoulder, pose a significant burden in relation to dysfunction and disability, and healthcare utilization. Access to quality MSK care is very important for Albertans living with these conditions.

The **MSK Transformation (MSK-T) Program**, a strategic priority of the Bone & Joint Health Strategic Clinical Network (BJH SCN), is being implemented to improve the MSK health system in Alberta, which will lead to quality improvement and better health care for Albertans.

The **purpose** of this study is to obtain a better understanding of the quality of MSK health care services in Alberta, specifically for shoulder, knee, and low back problems, from the perspective of patients and providers.
