


### Daily Reported New Positive COVID-19 Tests vs. Daily Reported Deaths with COVID-19 in the U.S.

February 26, 2020 - February 10, 2021




### U.S. COVID-19 Vaccine Doses Administered by Vaccine Type



A recent study done of the UK's vaccination program found that just a single dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine reduced the symptomatic infection risk from COVID-19 by 65% in younger adults and 64% in people over 80 years old.1

#### **Total Excess Deaths By Age Group**


January 4, 2020 – December 31, 2020, Weeks 1-52 in 2020

Data through the first nine months of 2020 show a 20.9% increase in homicides compared to the same period in 2019, the largest single-year increase in homicides since the U.S. started keeping such records in the 20th century, according to the FBI.<sup>2</sup>
