2. Certifications and/or training courses/programs

Six industry-recognized certifications that provide knowledge and skills related to safe work habits and sector-specific training and give students an advantage when entering the workforce. For instance, Standard First Aid, CPR Level C (including AED), customer service, and WHMIS generic instruction are compulsory certifications for Hospitality and Tourism.

3. Experiential learning and career exploration

Activities that take place outside the traditional classroom setting and allow students to observe, participate in, and reflect on a variety of sectorspecific experiences and careers. Examples include job shadowing, job twinning, worksite tours, and attendance at career fairs, conferences or competitions hosted by the sector.

4. Reach ahead experiences

Experiences connected with students' postsecondary plans that provide them with an opportunity to experience the next step in their chosen pathway. Examples include tours of colleges, universities, training facilities and workplaces, interviews of employees in the sector or students studying in the field, and dual credit courses.

5. Sector-partnered experiences

Activities that take a process-based approach to innovation, creativity and entrepreneurship by encouraging the application of key skills to a unique experience solving real-world, sector-relevant challenges, developed and delivered in collaboration with employers and community partners.
